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# Executive Summary

The first half of the financial year 2025–26 marked a period of sustained growth, impactful interventions, and strengthened community engagement for **Swavalamban Avam Swabhimaan Foundation (SAS Foundation)**. Between **April and September 2025**, the Foundation continued its mission to empower lives across its four core focus areas — **Education, Health, Environment, and Community Development** — in alignment with the **United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (UN SDGs)**.

## Programmatic Achievements

- **Education:** Empowered over **7,929 students** through book distribution and skill-based learning programs, including the IT Internship 2025–26 focused on cybersecurity awareness.
- **Health:** Conducted panel discussions on **breastfeeding awareness** and the **preventive role of physiotherapy**, while extending material support to youth under **Project Hope**.
- **Environment:** Advanced sustainable living through **e-waste collection drives** across Delhi NCR and Bangalore, along with the **Green Champions Internship** and **plant gifting** on Teacher's Day.
- **Community Development:** Fostered social inclusion through **new clothes and ration distribution**, **temple renovation**, and participation in **cultural festivals** such as Janmashtami and Ganesh Chaturthi.

## Organizational Strengthening

During this period, SAS Foundation:

- Signed a **Memorandum of Understanding (MoU)** with **Vihar Technocrats Association (VTA)** to strengthen volunteer engagement and social outreach.
- Completed the **FY 2024–25 statutory audit** through **ANH & Company**, with timely ITR filing.

- Maintained transparent accounting and compliance with the **Income Tax Act (Sections 12A & 80G)** and **CSR Rules 2021**.

SAS Foundation's initiatives during this period reaffirmed its commitment to creating sustainable, inclusive, and community-driven change. Through partnerships with schools, RWAs, NGOs, and individual contributors, the Foundation's work continues to inspire civic participation, youth empowerment, and responsible environmental behavior.

Swavalamban Avam Swabhimaan Foundation (SAS Foundation) is a non-governmental, non-profit organization dedicated to empowering lives through initiatives that promote education, health, environmental conservation, and community development. The Foundation's guiding philosophy is rooted in its name — *Swavalamban* (self-reliance) and *Swabhimaan* (self-respect) — reflecting its commitment to enabling individuals and communities to live with dignity, awareness, and purpose.

SAS Foundation was established on 9th September 2022 by a group of socially driven professionals and thought leaders. The organization is:

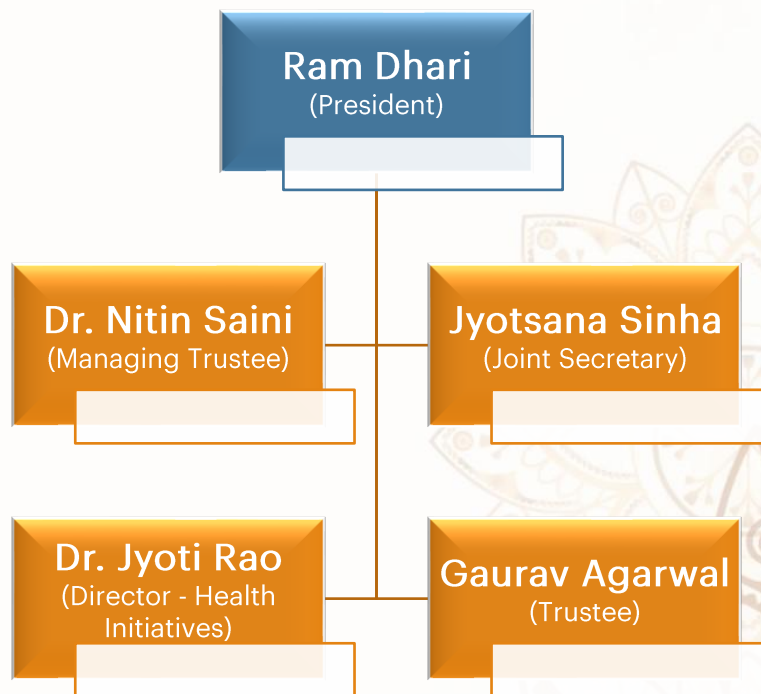
SAS Foundation operates on the principles of:

Between April and September 2025, Swavalamban Avam Swabhimaan Foundation (SAS Foundation) continued to expand its outreach and deepen its impact across all four core programmatic pillars – Education, Health, Environment, and Community Development.

This period was marked by consolidation of ongoing initiatives, the launch of new partnerships, and significant on-ground impact across multiple cities, including Delhi NCR, Bangalore, and Faridabad.

The Foundation conducted over 30 structured activities, reaching a total of 8,589 direct beneficiaries, with additional indirect beneficiaries through awareness and volunteer-driven campaigns.

- Conducted **seven large-scale Book Distribution Drives** across Delhi government schools, reaching more than **7,800 students** in Dwarka and Shahbad.
- Enhanced student digital access and reading culture under the “**Mission Learn & Lead**” theme.

## b. Expanding Environmental Stewardship

- Conducted multiple **E-Waste Collection Drives** across Delhi NCR, Faridabad, and Bangalore, enabling citizens to responsibly dispose of electronic waste.
- Introduced **Green Champions Internship (June 2025)** to engage youth in sustainability leadership.
- Celebrated **Teacher's Day with a Green Gift** initiative by distributing plants to educators, encouraging eco-conscious appreciation.

## c. Promoting Health Awareness

- Organized two health panels on **Breastfeeding Awareness (Aug 2025)** and **Preventive Role of Physiotherapy (Sep 2025)** to promote preventive health and community well-being.
- Supported underprivileged youth under **Project "Rings of Hope"**, providing boxing equipment to encourage physical and mental fitness.

- Distributed **new clothes** to children and residents at **Don Bosco Shelter Home, Auxilium Snehalaya, Bal Seva Sansthan, and RBHTC Hostel**, collectively reaching ~200 beneficiaries.

- Supported **temple renovation at Shiv Mandir, Palam**, and extended aid during **Janmashtami and Ganesh Chaturthi** celebrations to strengthen community bonds.
- Continued the **Ration Donation Program @ RBHTC**, ensuring regular food security for visually challenged beneficiaries.

- Maintained consistent recognition for ethical operations, transparent fund management, and measurable social outcomes.

The April–September 2025 period established a strong foundation for SAS Foundation’s future roadmap. The organization not only achieved programmatic success but also strengthened internal systems, financial governance, and collaborative networks — ensuring scalable, sustainable impact in the coming quarters.

SAS Foundation's work between **April and September 2025** spanned all four core pillars — **Education, Health, Environment, and Community Development**. Each pillar focused on measurable outcomes, community engagement, and sustainable change.

The following subsections outline the projects undertaken, their direct impact, and cumulative outcomes for the reporting period.

## EDUCATION PROJECTS

Education remains at the heart of SAS Foundation's mission to empower youth through access, awareness, and applied learning. The Foundation's educational programs during this half year aimed to:

- Enhance digital literacy and cybersecurity awareness.
- Improve learning resources for government school students.
- Promote equitable access to books and educational materials among underprivileged children.

A total of **7,929 beneficiaries** were reached through **eight major education initiatives** across Delhi.

### Case Highlight: “Learning Beyond Books”

During the *IT Internship Program 2025–26*, students expressed newfound confidence in using technology responsibly. The internship culminated in creative video assignments on *Cyber Safety in Daily Life*, showcasing how awareness-driven education can transform digital behavior.

This initiative not only equipped participants with 21st-century skills but also cultivated a sense of civic responsibility — a hallmark of SAS Foundation’s educational approach.

## HEALTH PROJECTS

Health remains a critical pillar of SAS Foundation’s mission, emphasizing *awareness, prevention, and access* as key drivers of community well-being.

During April–September 2025, SAS Foundation organized **three key health-focused initiatives**, addressing preventive healthcare, awareness on maternal health, and physical fitness through sports empowerment.

Collectively, these initiatives reached **159 direct beneficiaries**, primarily from Delhi NCR, under the Foundation’s goal of promoting **UN SDG 3 – Good Health and Well-Being**.

## Case Highlight: “Hope through Health”

The *Project Hope* initiative became a symbol of inspiration for several underprivileged youth who aspired to participate in district-level sports competitions.

By providing the right training gear and motivation, SAS Foundation enabled them to channel their energy into self-discipline, teamwork, and wellness. This initiative reinforced the Foundation’s belief that good health is not just medical — it’s also emotional, social, and empowering.

## ENVIRONMENT PROJECTS

Environmental conservation continues to be one of SAS Foundation’s strongest and most consistent areas of impact.

Between **April and September 2025**, the Foundation deepened its environmental stewardship efforts by conducting **13 targeted initiatives** — from e-waste collection drives and youth internships to sustainability awareness campaigns — across **Delhi NCR, Faridabad, and Bangalore**.

Through these initiatives, **421 lives were directly touched**, and several communities adopted responsible waste management practices, contributing to **UN SDG 11 (Sustainable Cities and Communities)**, **SDG 12 (Responsible Consumption and Production)**, and **SDG 13 (Climate Action)**.

### Case Highlight: "Mission e-Cycle"

The *Mission e-Cycle* campaign became a flagship model of behavioral change, encouraging residents to segregate and recycle electronics responsibly.

Through strategic engagement with RWAs, the initiative created micro-level sustainability champions within housing societies, making environmental action a collective habit rather than a one-time event.

## COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT PROJECTS

The **Community Development** pillar of SAS Foundation focuses on inclusion, dignity, and holistic well-being.

Between **April and September 2025**, the Foundation conducted **10 impactful initiatives**, ranging from **clothes and ration distribution** to **temple renovation** and **cultural celebrations**, ensuring that marginalized communities received sustained support and social participation opportunities.

These initiatives reached **580 direct beneficiaries** across Delhi NCR and reinforced the Foundation's commitment to **UN SDG 1 (No Poverty)**, **SDG 2 (Zero Hunger)**, **SDG 10 (Reduced Inequalities)**, and **SDG 11 (Sustainable Communities)**.

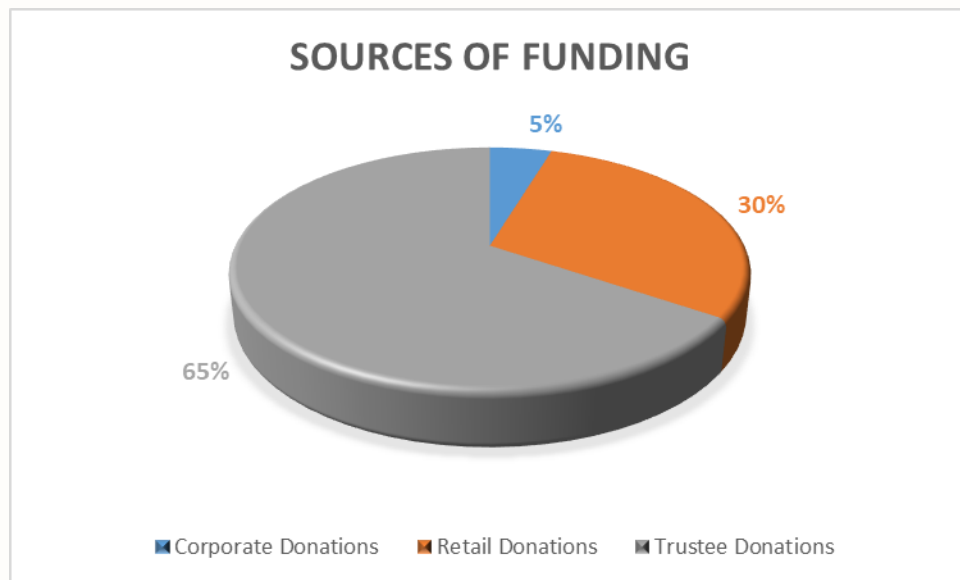
All financial transactions were executed through official banking channels under dual signatory authorization, and funds were utilized strictly for programmatic and administrative purposes as per the Foundation’s charter.

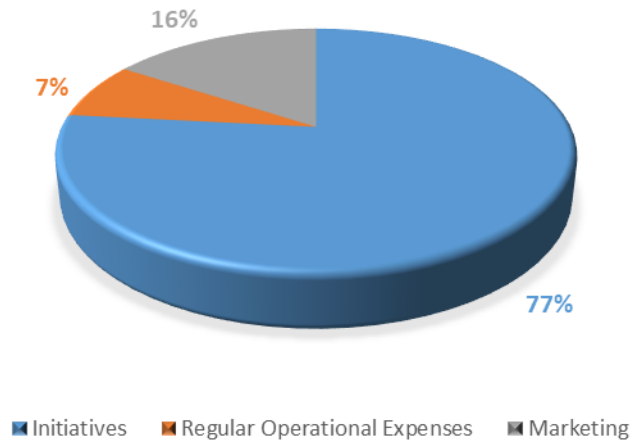

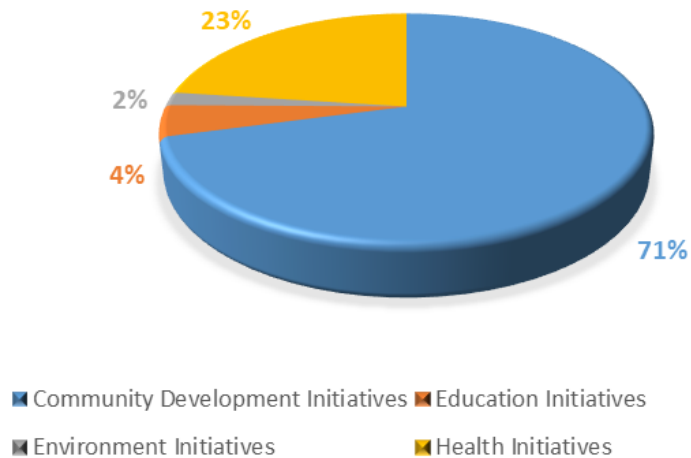

Impact stories are the heart of SAS Foundation's work — translating numbers into narratives and outcomes into lived experiences.

Each initiative underlines the Foundation's commitment to compassion, dignity, and empowerment through its four focus pillars: **Education, Health, Environment, and Community Development.**

The following real-life stories from April–September 2025 exemplify how small actions can create lasting change.

## Education: Opening Doors to Learning

**Project: "Books of Hope" (Books Distribution Drive @ Delhi Government Schools)**

**Impact: 7,929 students benefited**

In August and September 2025, SAS Foundation organized a series of **book distribution drives** across several government schools in Dwarka and Shahbad, including SBV, SKV, GCSSS (Sec 6, 13, 22), ASOSE, and RPVV.

The initiative aimed to support children from low-income families who often lacked access to basic learning materials.

Teachers reported a noticeable rise in enthusiasm among students as they received fresh academic and motivational books. For many, it was their first time owning personal reading materials. One student shared, *"These books are not just for studies — they make me dream bigger."*

This project directly supported **UN SDG 4 (Quality Education)** and helped nurture self-confidence, curiosity, and continued school engagement among young learners.

## Education: Building Digital Citizens

**Project: “InspireX” (IT Internship on Cybersecurity Awareness)**

**Impact: 84 students trained**

Through this unique 5-week internship program, high school students from Classes 9–12 explored the fundamentals of **cybersecurity, digital ethics, and online safety.**

Participants created presentations, short videos, and interactive sessions on “Safe Internet Practices.”

One student noted, *“I used to think cybersecurity was only for experts. Now, I know how to protect myself and others.”*

By introducing digital literacy in an experiential way, the Foundation empowered youth to become responsible digital citizens — aligning with **SDG 9 (Industry, Innovation, and Infrastructure)** and **SDG 16 (Peace, Justice, and Strong Institutions).**

## Health: Hope through Fitness

## Project: “Rings of Hope” (Boxing Equipment Support for Youth) Impact: 20 underprivileged youth supported

In September 2025, SAS Foundation launched **Project Hope** — providing boxing equipment to young athletes from low-income families.

This initiative recognized that sports not only build physical strength but also resilience, discipline, and confidence.

One of the beneficiaries, a 16-year-old aspiring boxer, shared, *“Now I can train without waiting for my turn to borrow gloves. I feel ready to win.”*

By investing in youth wellness through sports, SAS Foundation demonstrated how health initiatives can go beyond awareness — creating pathways to empowerment and opportunity.

## Environment: Responsible Recycling for a Greener Tomorrow

### Project: “Mission e-Cycle” (E-Waste Collection Drive in B’lore) Impact: 87 residents participated

In June 2025, SAS Foundation partnered with the RWA of Shriram Sphurti Apartments, Bangalore, to conduct a **community e-waste drive** under its *Mission e-Cycle* campaign.

The initiative educated residents on responsible electronic waste disposal, preventing hazardous waste from ending up in landfills.

The RWA appreciated SAS Foundation's structured collection and awareness model, noting, *"Your team's effort made sustainability practical for every household."*

This campaign fostered environmental accountability among citizens and reinforced the Foundation's ongoing leadership in **SDG 12 (Responsible Consumption and Production)** and **SDG 13 (Climate Action)**.

## Community Development: Dignity in Giving

**Project: "Samaan"** (New Clothes Distribution @ Shelter Homes (Don Bosco, Snehalaya, Bal Seva Sansthan, RBHTC))

**Impact: 196 beneficiaries across Delhi**

SAS Foundation's new clothes distribution drives during July–August 2025 brought smiles and dignity to children and adults in need.

The initiative focused on ensuring that every individual — from shelter homes to visually challenged residents — received clothing appropriate for their needs and festive seasons.

A sister at Auxilium Snehalaya remarked, *"Your gesture made our girls feel special — like they truly belong."*

The project also encouraged donors and volunteers to participate personally, reinforcing compassion as a shared responsibility.

## Community Development: Faith and Fellowship

**Project: “MandirSaathi”** (Temple Renovation and Festival Support @ Shiv Mandir, Palam)

**Impact: 200 residents engaged**

SAS Foundation supported renovation work for the Shiv Mandir gate and railings at Palam in July 2025.

The initiative also extended to **Janmashtami and Ganesh Chaturthi celebrations**, strengthening cultural heritage and community participation.

Local priest Pt. Nitin Parashar shared, *“Your support helped us restore our temple and celebrate together after years. It brought unity and pride to our neighborhood.”*

Through this effort, SAS Foundation reaffirmed its commitment to **preserving local culture and community identity**, blending development with dignity.

## Health Awareness: Empowering Conversations

**Project: “SAS Aarogyam”** (Panel Discussion on Breastfeeding Awareness)

**Impact: 89 participants**

Organized in August 2025, this panel brought together doctors, educators, and parents to discuss the importance of breastfeeding for both maternal and child health.

Participants expressed gratitude for the platform, where real questions met practical, science-based answers.

This initiative strengthened public understanding of **early childhood nutrition**, empowering families through knowledge and reinforcing **SDG 3 (Good Health and Well-Being)**.

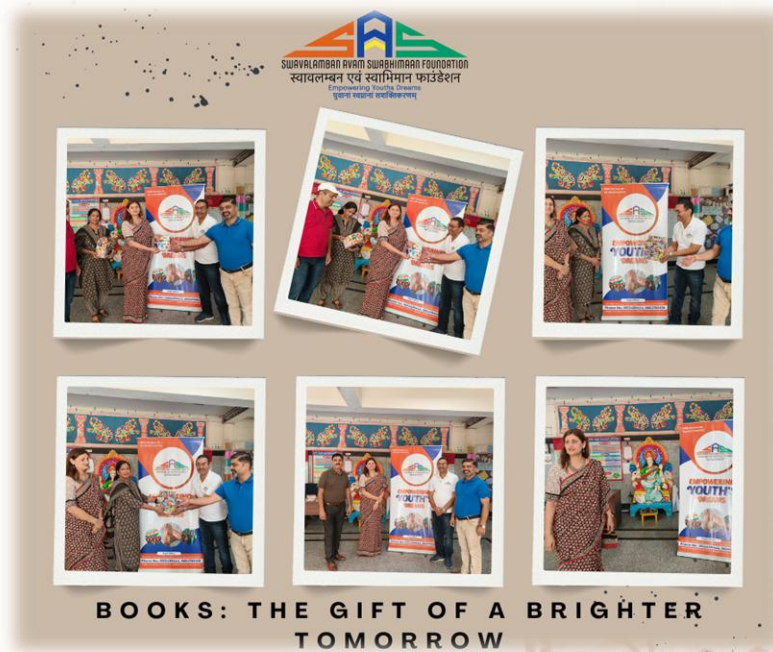


Figure 3 Books Distribution @ GCSSS, Sec 13, Dwarka, Delhi (Sep '25)

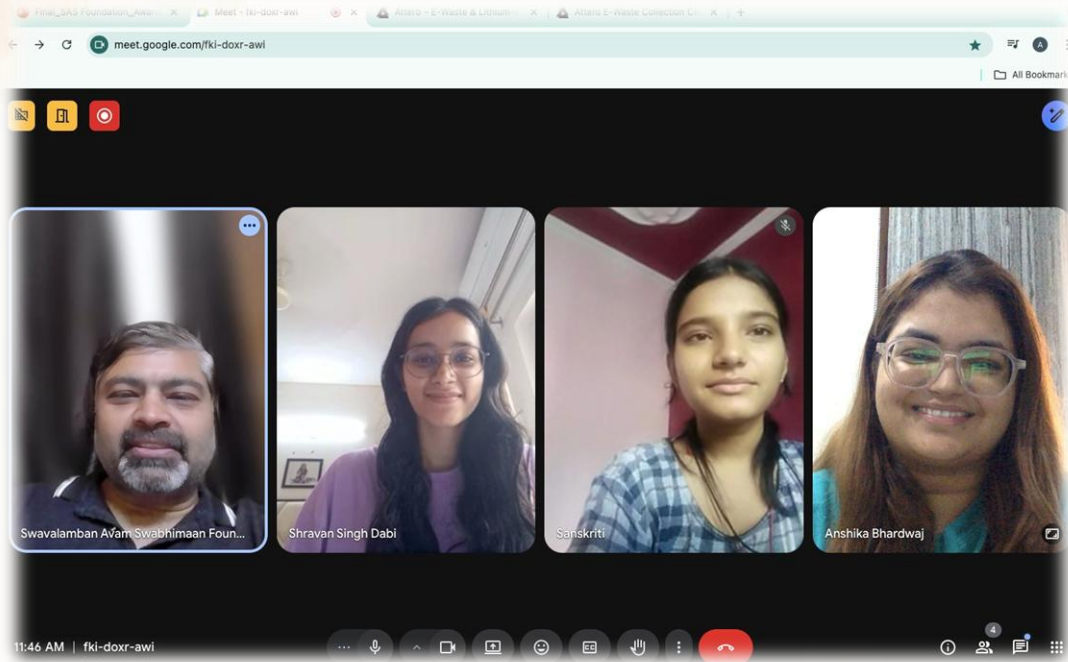


Figure 16 Green Champions Internship 2025 (Jun '25)

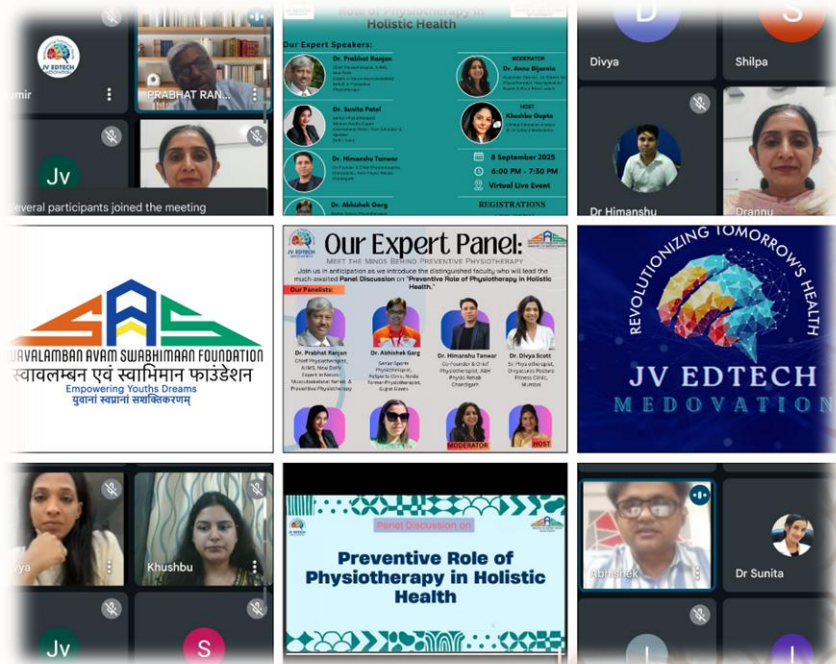


Figure 27 Panel Discussion - Preventive Role of Physiotherapy (Sep '25)
